Tennessee AWSC Spring Assembly June 1, 2024

The 2024 Spring Assembly met on June 1, 2024 at Lebanon, TN. The meeting was called to order at 9:03 am by Tarcila F., Chairperson with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer. Area Chairpersons Elections	 Tarcila shared that elections for Secretary and Treasurer were held and appointed at the Fall, 2023 Assembly. However, due to personal reasons, both parties had to resign. As Area Chairperson, Tarcila appointed Christine F. as Interim Area Secretary and Patty C., Interim Area Treasurer, were approved. Opportunities were given for District Representatives (DRs) in the room and on Zoom to stand for the positions. No DR stood. Tarcila proposed and received permission to allow qualified members who were not current or past DRs to stand for the positions. Patty C., shared her experience to be considered as Treasurer; Marian M. for position of Secretary. Motion #1 to elect Patty C. as Area Treasurer was made by Grace M. (D 13) and seconded by Alicia A. (D13 Ten votes in the room and 21 by Zoom were counted, zero nays, and zero abstentions. Motion #1 was unanimously approved. Motion #2 to recommend Marian P. to be Secretary was made by Shelly (D20B) and seconded by Alicia A. There were 10 yeas in the room and 21 by zoom; no nays, and no abstentions. Convention Coordinator	Cindy H. reported on the proposed program for the convention (August 16-18, 2024) with five speakers, Alateen speaker, closed Alateen meetings, and entertainment. Forms can be found online. Alateen need special forms to be completed. They can be done online or by mail. There is a \$10 discount before August 1 st for registration. Zoom tickets are \$20 each. There are two hotels adjacent and another is expected to open before Convention. Fundraising methods were discussed. Delegate Report	Irene F. shared that WSC has a special appeal for funds since COVID. Membership supports program. Her report (posted on groups.io) showed that literature sales made a profit that went to general contributions. One hundred percent of groups use WSO, use CAL, app, and new Public Service announcements. One idea is to send WSO \$10 for each year of recovery. Election Process Guidelines	 Tarcila F. presented a KBDM to update the current Election Procedures. The suggested changes are found at the Area website and on groups.io. Motion #5 to accept the election procedures as modified as updated was made by Janet L. (D20C); second was made by Debra T. (D12C). There were 0 nays; 0 abstentions; and 10 yeas. Motion #5 carried. Literature	Ben V., Literature Coordinator, highlighted ideas for groups to use literature, such as a lending library, displaying literature (ordered from local distribution center); newsletter additions about CAL, brainstorming, creating enthusiasm for lit. "Opening our Hearts, Transforming Our Loses" is a good source for grief of any kind. A literature center can be started using the guidelines.	No action necessary.
Technology	Erik, Technology Coordinator, shared the Tech Team/Committee is discussing how best to integrate electronic meetings. A GR orientation was completed via Zoom; Alateen recently met via Zoom. During the Convention, zoom will be offered with a \$20 registration. They will record for the main room/speakers only. There is not the equipment nor volunteers to manage breakout rooms, etc. Need volunteers to be certain people are allowed into Zoom, keep video and mute/unmute used; if chat is used, need someone to monitor that and respond.	No action at this time.
Al-Anon Information Service Liaison (AISL) (KADA)	Carol advised that the Liaison acts as a service group link between AWSC and WSO; serves for three years. A report was submitted, AISL – KADA, District 2-3 that 6 meetings are electronic, 6 hybrids, 19 in person, 1 Alateen, 5 meet at same time/venue as AA.	No action needed.

Caucus	Alicia A. (D13) reported that currently there is no DR for the District. She asked folks to go back to groups, make the need known, and ask people to step up. In attendance, there are 3 GRs with no DR; in Zoom, there are 2. Tarcila reminded that a DR goes to AWSC meetings and helps to set the agenda for Assembly.	Requested that GRs and DRs encourage groups to elect GRs.
Mixer	Linda invited folks to share their experience with the mixer activity. Many chose to share their program progress.	No action needed.
GR Reports	 Becca shared that about ½ of groups attend "the trailer." They started speaker meetings every two months. Barbara, Galatin, the group is happy and very supportive; they have folks on the "25-year Plan" and newcomers. Main challenge is what is expected of her; sponsors have been supportive. Arlene (D12B) reported about a Women's Focus Group-Topic Meeting: it is flourishing with 40-50 each week and about 2-3 newcomers regularly. They do an inventory meeting on the 5th Wednesday about 2-3 times a year. No service positions are open. Cindy informed there are 5 meetings a week with about 40-50 people each. Recovery first, willing to step out of box; always someone to ask for help. Susie shared Nashville has an AA meeting at the same time; business meeting every odd month with 12-15 members. There is a Newcomers meeting as a hybrid. Inventory on 5th Thursdays. All service positions are filled. Grace, Alt GR, two meetings/week; book studies: "In all our Affairs" and "How Al-Anon Works;" 8-15 members. Steve (D8) said the average is 8-15 people per week with a mix of long-time and fairly new. This group is in isolation – other group is about 30 miles away. He will encourage people to get out more. Gay (D12B) Western Nashville, agreed it is not easy to do hybrid meetings; however, they have blossomed in the past year; there are newcomers every week, a newcomers' meeting seems to help retain; about 20 people each week now. They do Step and Tradition meetings; a business meeting every other month, with people submitting topics. Service positions still need to be filled. 	No actions necessary; reports only.

Spiritual Sharing	 Loring T. (D5A) shared "When I Got Busy, I Got Better." Together accomplish what cannot accomplish individually. As understanding Tradition 1, behavior effects group and individual. Learned to listen more, different attitude. Always better when everyone contributes. So grateful for Tradition 1 and different than when first came in, Higher Power, different choices. Personal contribution to the common welfare was to show up at meetings. Had an internal shift. Ben V. shared about reasons to go to meetings: 1) a need to go; 2) go when he doesn't think he needs to go. Sometimes, it's not for himself but for the common welfare; always glad when he goes to a meeting. Carol M. indicated that Traditions help her to apply principles to family. She practices in Al-Anon Family group-her chosen family. Have to give away in order to keep. Without program, not as happy and serene. Tarcila noted she felt cynical about "After a while love us as we already love you." Realized service is an active form of love: set up, tear down, etc. Al-Anon gave ability to open mind, see signs of love, look at beautiful things. Gay shared it took a while to understand how much power/grace is in the room. Could feel folks caring about her after 2-3 meetings. She is grateful and content about her group. Ken talked about "Let it Begin with Me." Just by walking in, newcomers might not know at first. "Don't know what you don't know until you know it." Get in the middle of the herd. Alicia A. referred back to the mixer. Began recovery at 44 years. In Al-anon group loved her when she could not love herself. She felt seen/heard/valued; belonged to something; unity. Al-Anon saved my life; she is grateful she is able to serve. 	No further action.

Questions can be submitted anonymously. Question was to explain "cross talk" and how it can be avoided in meetings. There was a question about strategies/protocol for business meetings. 	Comments only; no action.
